Please join us for our annual GATE Open House for NEW families. This presentation will answer common questions about Sunset Lane's GATE program. Sunset Lane GATE team continues to pursue depth and complexity in academic content areas. One way to look deeper into ideas is looking at content through multiple perspectives. Multiple perspectives gives students different points of view on events, people, ideas, and issues. One example of this is to explore events in stories or history from more than one person or character's lens. This gives students a way to practice empathy and learn to walk in another person's shoes. Another way to look deeper into ideas is looking at content through an ethical perspective. Ethics asks us to look at moral dilemmas and consider situations where right and wrong aren't clear. Exploring problems, ambiguities and deciphering what is good or bad in historical events and novels allows students to practice thinking deeper about complex ideas. Ask your child to consider multiple perspectives and ethical dilemmas in your own family dynamics.
