College & Career Readiness: Understanding FAFSA

What is FAFSA?



The FAFSA (Free Application for Federal Student Aid) is a form used to apply for federal financial aid for career or career school. It is a service provided by the Federal Aid Office.

The Federal Aid Office is a division of the U.S. Department of Education.



What is CA Dream Act Application?



The CADAA (California Dream Act Application) is a form used only in CA apply for state financial aid for career or career school.

California Student Aid Commission processes CADAA applications.



Why is Financial Aid Important?



Your application is used to determine eligibility for federal, state, and school aid.

Types of financial aid:

- Grants
- Scholarships
- Work-Study Programs
- Student Loans





What is the Difference Among These Four Types?





Grant money is typically based on you and your family's financial situation. They DON'T have to repaid, as long as you meet the requirements.



Scholarship money is typically awarded based on your accomplishments. It DOESN'T have to repaid, as long as you meet the requirements.



Work-study programs offer career-related work experience, allowing you to earn money while working throughout the school year.

Student Loans

Student loans MUST be repaid. There are various types of student loans, and some have better terms than others. It is important to research and fully understand what you are agreeing to before taking out a loan. Consider the future.



Who Should Fill Out a FAFSA/CADAA Form?



 All 12th graders need to apply. (CA high school graduation requirement.)

- FAFSA
 - US citizens
 - Permanent Residents
- CADAA
 - Undocumented, non-residents
 - No SSN or DACA SSN



What Information is Required?



The FAFSA/CADAA form requires student/parent to provide:

- personal and financial information, including information from tax forms (Class of 2025 uses 2023 taxes)
- balances of savings and checking accounts.

Who Is The Parent?



- Biological parent(s) student lives with
- If parents divorced or separated
 → who does the student live with the most?
- If student lives with one biological parent and step-parent→ step-parents income must be included
- Adoptive parent(s)
- If a student is or was in foster care (16-18 years old)→ the student considered independent



Who Is **NOT** The Parent?



- Legal Guardians
- Aunt or uncle
- Grandparents
- Older brother or sister
- Foster parent

(Unless they have legally adopted the child.)

For eligible California residents, the California Community Colleges permits enrollment fees to be waived.







From May 1 - 31, we honor Asian Americans and Pacific Islanders who have enriched America's history and are instrumental in its future success.






What is considered Asian American and Pacific Islander (AAPI)?


