What is a School wide Title I Program?



- Title I is one part of the Every Student Succeeds Act (ESSA) reauthorized in 2017 .
- A schoolwide program is a comprehensive reform strategy designed to upgrade the entire educational program; its primary goal is to ensure that all students, particularly those who are low-achieving, demonstrate proficient and advanced levels of achievement on State academic achievement standards.

How does a school qualify for a School wide Title I Program?



- Title I school may operate as a schoolwide program only if a minimum of 40 percent of the students in the school, or residing in the attendance area served by the school, are from low-income families (participating in National School Lunch Program (NSLP)).
- Nicolas Junior High School has 81% percentage of families participating in the NSLP.

What does the Title I Program look like at our school?
