

FSD GATE Placement Procedure

Students identified as GATE may, at parent request, be placed in a GATE Designated Class at a GATE Designated Site. Not all schools have a GATE Designated Class on site, but are instead assigned to a GATE Designated Class at a different school, where they have placement priority. The following describes the timeline and procedure for placing GATE students in requested GATE Designated Classes.

- 1. GATE Identification Parent Notification letters mailed out first week of January
- 2. GATE transfers are based on space availability. In order to accommodate GATE families, impacted sites may hold a lottery as outlined below
- 3. GATE Parent Orientation held at District Office third week of January
- 4. GATE Open Houses held at school sites late January/early February
- 5. Deadline to submit GATE Enrollment Form to align with FSD Open Enrollment deadline
- 6. Notification of GATE placement to align with FSD Open Enrollment date
- 7. GATE Program begins on the first day of school

SPACE AVAILABILITY & PLACEMENT

- 1. First priority is given to home school residents
- 2. Second priority is given to residents of GATE Designated Site Home Schools (i.e., schools assigned to the GATE Designated Site)
- 3. Additional priorities are determined by applying the District's Open Enrollment Hierarchy of Priority Placement in effect at the time
 - a) Siblings of Intradistrict or Interdistrict Transfers currently enrolled at the school
- 4. In the event there is not space for all students within a priority listed above, a random, unbiased process (i.e., a random lottery process) will be conducted to determine which students within that priority will be placed in the class
- 5. After applying priorities listed above, if there continues to be space in the desired class, remaining students will be selected by a random lottery process, as described below.

RANDOM LOTTERY PROCESS – A Site Administrator, Staff Member, and FSD GATE Coordinator will conduct a random lottery process as outlined:

- 1. Students in the random lottery will be assigned numbers
- 2. Random Number Generator will be used to digitally select numbers
- 3. Students not selected for the class will be notified within one week of the random lottery process
- Students not selected for the class will be offered placement in general education at the desired site, in a GATE cluster, OR in a GATE Designated Class at another GATE Designated Site, space permitting
- 5. Parents must notify GATE Office of their decision of which program their child will enroll in <u>before</u> the end of the FSD Open Enrollment deadline
