The 2020 National Middle School Speech and Debate Competition was held virtually this year and Fullerton School District had an amazing showing. Parks Junior High School is the National Champion this year, receiving a National School of Excellence Award. During Distance Learning, 40 FSD students continued to dedicate themselves to a virtual Speech and Debate world. They learned how to make a connection with

their peers, build a strong virtual presence, and effectively communicate verbally and nonverbally to an audience.

These students are now the pioneers of Virtual Speech competition and have made a mark in history. This cannot have been accomplished without various people trusting and believing in the process and the students. At any time in the day, students tried something new for the first time whether it was a new coaching technique or a new online program. Teachers and principals navigated ways to correspond with students and support them during this stressful time. District IT personnel provided assistance at all hours of the day whenever there was a technical issue.

Overall, FSD had 40 students participate from 11 different schools. FSD is proud to have ten of the Top-Ten Student participants and 12 of the Top-Ten Recognitions in seven different events. Congratulations to all the participants, teachers, and parents for this amazing accomplishment.

FSD Students Perform well on Advanced Placement Exams

Distance Learning and virtual tests didn't stand in the way of Fullerton School District (FSD) students taking the Advanced Placement exams. This year, 83 FSD students took the AP exam with outstanding results. A total of 37 students took the AP Computer Science Principles or AP Computer Science A test with pass rates of 74% and 17%, respectively. There were 46 students

who took the AP English Language and Composition test with a 74% pass rate. This exam is usually not provided for students until at least 10th grade, yet Fullerton School District serves students in grades K – 8th. Not only did 83

FSD students take the AP Exam, a high number of students scored high enough to earn college credit!

Students from five FSD schools participated in the AP testing, including Beechwood School, Fisler School, Ladera Vista Junior High School of the Arts, Nicolas Junior High School, and Parks Junior High School. FSD very proud of the accomplishments of our students and the guidance provided by our instructional leaders. At a typical high school, the average pass rate of students who have completed a Computer Science course and take the AP Exam is 10-15%. The pass rate of our junior high school students rivals the rate of high school students. Fullerton School District is looking to further strengthen our class offerings and anticipates increasing numbers of students passing AP Exams.

Positive Behavioral Interventions and Supports (PBIS)

Positive Behavioral Interventions and Supports (PBIS) is a framework for organizing systems and practices that focus on creating a positive and supportive school culture for all. Ladera Vista Junior High School for the Arts utilizes this practice in the daily operation of the school and informs students and parents of the expectations while they are on campus

at the beginning of every school year.

The beginning of the 2020-2021 school year saw vast changes to the delivery of PBIS due to COVID 19 and the students distance learning. The information was presented to students through a zoom meeting format while they were in their homeroom. In addition to our normal focus topics of digital citizenship and virtually meeting the staff, new areas of learning such as zoom expectations and a distance learning PBIS matrix were incorporated into the presentation. The zoom expectations highlighted general guidelines when using zoom; where to find the links for each class, being kind, courteous, respectful and present when attending and using the chat feature as a classroom tool. The distance learning PBIS matrix followed our schoolwide PRIDE matrix but was changed to encompass: entering a virtual classroom, the teacher is leading a whole group lesson, breakout rooms, independent work and one to one instruction. Teaching the student's the rules related to the new platform within the first days of schools was vital in ensuring students were set up for a successful school year.

Moving forward, Ladera Vista Junior High School for the Arts will continue to utilize the PBIS strategies. As students return to school, a new matrix will be constructed to include all the rules associated with social distancing, personal protection equipment and expectations for moving around campus. We will continue to create a positive and supportive school culture with all safety measures in place.

A History of Adapting

In 2024-2025, Maple School will become the first elementary school in Fullerton to celebrate its 100th anniversary. Constructed in 1923 and opened in Fall 1924, Maple School originally cost \$100,000 to build! In 1933, Maple School sustained heavy damage in the Long Beach earthquake and, in 1935, Maple lost its first principal, Helena Smith. Through it all, Maple was able to adapt and survive! Though times have changed and

costs have dramatically increased, Maple continues to grow and adapt to the changing needs of our community.

Last Spring, Maple was uniquely prepared for the challenges of the pandemic and the transition to distance learning. For the past 3 years, Maple had been issuing

iPads to all students in Transitional Kindergarten through 6th grade. Students used the devices for in-class learning and also took them home each night to continue and expand upon their classroom lessons. Because of this experience, most of our students were already accustomed to the blended learning programs and learning management systems that students across the world were then struggling to learn.

Maple has survived and thrived based on its ability to adapt and change with the times. Today, Maple's mission is to provide a world-class education to its students through experiential learning, and though some elements of our experiential learning model have been difficult to implement during the pandemic, we know that we will grow and adapt as necessary to meet the needs of our students and community.



The 2020-2021 school year brought a new and exciting change to both of our campuses. Not only do we have distance learning, but did you know we have distance cooking? Last year, through a partnership with the Orange County Department of Education, the Dolphin Community participated in family


cooking classes held at our Dolphin Market. Even though the pandemic


The Virtual Library
